We recently added a search bar to the site so if you're looking for a specific resource, you can easily find it by utilizing the search feature. (talk about drive) We're also working on adding access to a public folder on our Google Drive. This would enable FD, Coordinators, and Admin to add their own resources for members to easily access through the website.

Budget— The budget has increased this year due to an additional plugin for the website that will allow more materials to be made publicly available on the website (PR materials, workshop, videos, materials created by workgroups, etc) and to buy additional equipment for hybrid setups. Hybrid isn't going anywhere and really, the cost savings in allowing Bermuda to participate virtually versus buying a plane ticket for them to attend every RSC makes it financially prudent many times over. Corrections Resource Coordinator Report

Greetings Florida Region,

My name is Colin H and I'm an addict. I am currently serving as the Corrections Coordinator for the Florida Region and the lead for the Corrections Workgroup.

What is the corrections workgroup you say?

The corrections workgroup consists of several related projects that serve to bring the message of NA recovery to the addicts behind the walls in the state of Florida. We also work with and educate the administration at the state level DOC regarding the continued success of NA to improve the lives of those they serve. Please be aware that working with the DOC does not mesh well with the spirit of rotation and does not sync up with the spirit of anonymity.

These top level projects are:

Behind the Walls: taking meetings into and building home groups that exist behind the walls of state and federal correctional institutions. This includes literature delivery to institutions to support this effort. The end game for this project is to have the addicts behind the walls running their own meetings. Depending on the institution, there are varying levels of this occurring.

The Inmate Step working guide group is alive and well and anonymously working steps through the mail with those behind the walls. This group is based out of the Gold Coast area. The last numbers I received in October was that around 30 addicts were working steps anonymously with this group.

The Bridging the Gap program is alive and well and addicts are being scheduled to meet those who are getting released at a meeting. Recently as part of brainstorming during the workgroup, the bridging the gap program is being opened up outside of just those within the corrections workgroup. There are several members in various H&I subcommittees across the region that we have found would be willing to meet members after their release. Please bring up at your H&I areas if you would like to share your contact list with us for your area for this effort.

The Between the walls program is still in beta and should be starting in the next few months. This will start at the NW Florida Reception Center and we are still working out the details. This institution was chosen by Tallahassee since everyone at that institution has less than a year left to serve on their sentence. The DTEN Zoom monitor is set up and we are actively meeting with the warden and chaplain at that institution

This means you will be able to chair a Zoom meeting from the comfort of your couch where all the participants are behind the walls at a Florida institution. Please contact me or the workgroup because we need volunteers to do this! I know several of you have told me that the reason you don't want to serve is because of the anxiety of going into prisons, so this is your solution!

The workgroup meets every other Thursday from 8-9p over Zoom.

We are down to the last parts of the talks so expect to have meetings running within the next few months! The meetings will likely be a week day (the present discussion is for Tuesday) and it's going to be starting around 10a. This will be a 90 minute meeting. So if you are retired or just off on a weekday and would like to carry the message to the most concentrated place it is needed, please reach out to me.

The East Coast Convention was a huge success and made just over fifty thousand dollars to donate books for those behind the walls. We have received the shipment for that this past few weeks consisting of just under 100 basic texts, so large thanks to them for supporting recovery behind the walls in the Florida Region.

Hope rises is amazing and continues to provide literature to ongoing BTW meetings in the Florida Region.

The documentation for supplying the IPs to the tablets is still sitting in the legal department in Tallahassee -Recently, Indiana approved the NA literature for all of their prisons with tablets. I've been sending promotional NA videos from that approval to my contact at Tallahassee to hopefully shame them to get us moving forward towards an approval. Please show up to the bi-weekly meeting on Thursdays.

I have met with one of the Coleman Federal substance abuse representatives who has posted our flyers at Coleman for individuals who would like to pursue more information about NA while they are there.

Institution Status

Lowell meetings continue to occur at the Women's Reception Center and the work camp, with meetings are going strong and I'm happy to report that they have a meeting at Lowell every week! Technically it's every other week at the Work Camp and every other week at the Reception Center, but we are there weekly bringing the message. Thank you to the woman who have stepped up to make that a reality. Men, we need you!

Lawtey CI meetings are alive and well and being run by a long term addict there behind the walls.

I'm happy to say that the Miracle at Madison NA meeting has been regularly meeting twice a month since it was started by the generous dedication of time and service by volunteers in the workgroup.

Madison CI is meeting twice a month regardless of whether or not we show up.

We have a call a prison party coming up in April, please contact me if you want to help out.

INVEST IN OUR VISION

Most NA members are not wealthy people. In fact, many of us are just getting by. What we know about the Fellowship of NA, though, is that when we work together, we can move mountains.

Anthony from NAWS reported that member contributions were what had saved them at NAWS—they were the key to future sustainability; however, when the entire literature engine cranked back up in North America—literature purchased in areas, and at groups—he imagined our income would increase. He said NAWS would need to hire a couple more people to meet the backlog of services and would purposely lower the cash in the balance sheet to do so.

We are alive and recovering because of the power of our collective efforts. Together we can do what others cannot.

We need to take the same approach to funding our services. World Services is not feeling the pinch alone. Service bodies and offices around the world that have depended on profits from events or literature sales to fund their efforts are also hurting for money because of the effects of the pandemic. We can work together to fund service on every level.

Please keep in mind that World Services is still providing free literature to inmates, and areas/members that cannot afford to pay. In prior years, this has exceeded \$800,000. If the funds are not there, this service will no longer be available and this is one of the ways we carry the message to addicts who are still suffering, which is our primary purpose.

Most money in the basket stays at the local level. We in the Florida Region do a better job of this than other areas and regions

Lit. sales up to now is what has supported NAWS. We need to rely less on Lit. sales and more on self (the basket). 2020 rocked the world: NA world Services close the doors and furloughed ½ the employees

2020 50 members \$2000 monthly recurring donations

2021 700 members \$20,000 monthly recurring donations

2022 Goal: Increase direct Recurring Contributions and increase 7th tradition Basket money. which has been done but we still have a long way to go to be fully self supporting and not rely on literature sales for our operating costs

Good Afternoon All,

HRP met three time since the November RSC. November 23, January 8th, and January 14th.

On November 23rd, HRP had a debriefing meeting with Michael and the Corrections Coordinator. Michael is shadowing the Treasurer Team and was able to get some hands-on experience since one of the members was absent. The Corrections Coordinator had an opportunity to assist with facilitation during Fellowship Development (FD). Please remember, we have 7 people rolling off this year and as a result of the accumulation, there will be 8 positions up for elections (FD co-leader, Co-Facilitator, Corrections Coordinator, Technology Coordinator, Technology Co-Coordinator, Regional Delegate (RD) and 3 HRP members. While shadowing a position does not guarantee that you will be elected to that position, as you will still have to go through the election process, interviewing, nomination, it does allow you to gain first-hand experience regarding the duties and responsibilities of the position so you can make a more informed decision about the skills requirement as well as time commitment.

During the January 8th meeting, we discussed Jennifer's access to the shared drive, email set-up, and assigned her responsibilities. We revisited our budget and recalculated the proposed increase for in-house print and supplies. Happy New Year RSC. Your Florida regional service office is alive and well. The BOD met last weekend. 8 members were present. We still need one board member. The qualifications are 1) Three (3) years abstinence from all drugs. 2) At least one (1) year prior experience in business, management, or prior Board involvement 3) Present membership, in good standing, in the Florida Region of N.A.

We continue to claw our way back to financial stability. It has been a long road and we still have a way to go. Our Financials are as follows:

Our treasurer reports that we are still operating at a loss but are improving as our sales increase. We continue to seek ways to reduce our overhead cost and to reduce fixed costs. We will be able to cut cost including discontinuing product cart (\$100/mo) which can be discontinued now and authorize.net (several hundred per mo) that may be discontinued once the new processing is shown to be effective. Returned check fees are being recouped, but sometimes we must flag accounts that dispute credit card charges until the charge is satisfied. Our tax return form 990 is filed and that's gets us completely caught up with the IRS

The web site is up but of course we still have some bugs to work out. Overall, the feedback is positive. We have been Struggling with the new processor but have got it working.

We have submitted paperwork for echecks (ACH) as well as credit cards. The New order forms have been sent to most Areas and I have bought a copy for each of you. We are Addressing concerns with some areas unclear about the price increases.

We are looking for more ways to increase our cash flow. We have received the list of WSO approved venders and we are mailing and emailing them to gauge their interest in showing their merchandise on our web site. One of the advantages to our new web site is the ease of putting up and/or taking down items. We would process the orders and send them to the venders they would ship them, and we would pay them and keep a percentage of the sale. There would be little labor cost and no expense to the RSO. The letter has been reviewed and approved by the board and will go out shortly. More will be revealed.

Your RSO Board and workers are striving to return to pre covid sales level but are concerned that literature sales may never return to that level. Virtual meetings, digital literature and phones all will affect sales of books and other

literature. We will face difficult decisions in the future and we will continue to face them as they come up. I want to take a moment to discuss, for the new RCM's, the 7th tradition basket fund flow and RSO funds. We are a stand alone corporation and our funds come from the sales of literature and other items. No funds from the basket are used by the RSO. No funds lost or stolen by or from the RSO effect the 7th tradition basket.

Invest In Our Vision

- Most NA members are not wealthy people. In fact, many of us are just getting by. What we know about the Fellowship of NA, though, is that when we work together, we can move mountains. Anthony from NAWS reported that member contributions were what had saved them at NAWS—they were the key to future sustainability; however, when the entire literature engine cranked back up in North America—literature purchased in areas, and at groups—he imagined our income would increase. He said NAWS would need to hire a couple more people to meet the backlog of services and would purposely lower the cash in the balance sheet to do so.
- We are alive and recovering because of the power of our collective efforts. Together we can
 do what others cannot. We need to take the same approach to funding our services. World
 Services is not feeling the pinch alone. Service bodies and offices around the world that have
 depended on profits from events or literature sales to fund their efforts are also hurting for
 money because of the effects of the pandemic. We can work together to fund service on every
 level.
- Please keep in mind that World Services is still providing free literature to inmates, and areas/members that cannot afford to pay. In prior years, this has exceeded \$800,000. If the funds are not there, this service will no longer be available and this is one of the ways we carry the message to addicts who are still suffering, which is our primary purpose.

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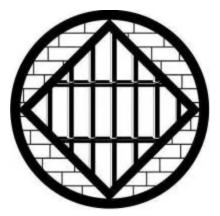

Bridging the Gap Narcotics Anonymous Florida Region Information Sheet

Our experience has shown that attending an NA meeting on the outside the same day you are released is one of the most important things you can do for your recovery. Narcotics Anonymous and the Florida Region have begun a transition program called Bridging the Gap. The Bridging the Gap Project seeks to connect you with someone from

your home community that has agreed to send you information about Narcotics Anonymous. Upon your release, they may take you to your first few meetings, introduce you to other NA members, and help you get acquainted and comfortable among new friends in NA. During this time, some of the things you will learn about are sponsors, home groups, working the steps, and service.

Your Bridging the Gap volunteer is only temporary. They won't follow you around or control your activities, nor will they provide you with a job, money, housing, food, clothing, or any other such service. The Bridging the Gap Project volunteer is NOT a sponsor, not even a temporary sponsor. We believe that it is best for you to choose a sponsor for yourself once you are released.

It is our hope that this service will help the suffering addict find the solution that we have found. Our purpose is to carry the message of recovery, "That no addict, anywhere, need die from the horrors of addiction."

Speak with the Chaplain or the Programs Director at your institution and explain to them that you are interested to participate with this program. HOW IT WORKS

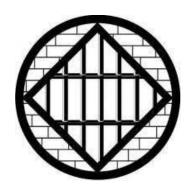

You will arrange to connect with the newcomer at a meeting as soon as possible. At the meeting you will introduce the newcomer to other members of the fellowship, explain about NA literature, provide a meeting list, and encourage the newcomer to join in fellowship after the meeting. You will make additional arrangements to meet at three or four meetings over the next couple of weeks.

This is not a temporary sponsor program. It is simply helping the newcomer feel welcome and connected to the fellowship. That is all there is to it. Help make this project be a success and volunteer today.

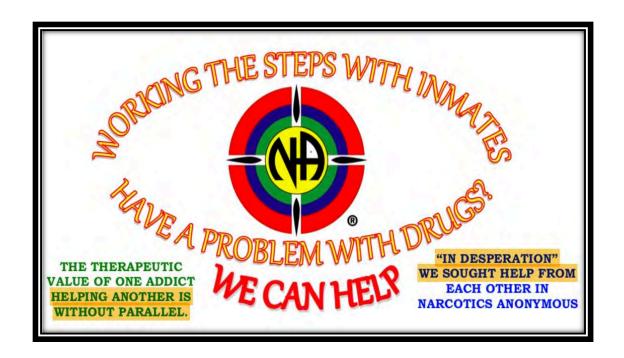

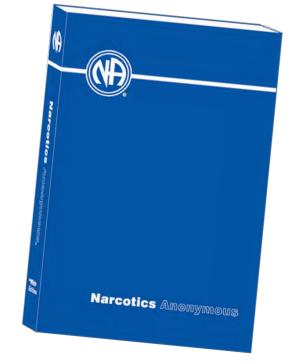
